Not since the darkest days of World War II has the United States been jarred by so many foreign policy failures in so short a

With the impending collapse of Cambodia and Vietnam, with the sudden assausination of King Paisal coming on the heels of Dr Kinsinger's political defeat in the Mideast, and with festering prob lems inside NATO, the conclusion is that things are indeed going

verypoorly for Washington.
The big danger that many observers see now is that the United States, licking its Southeast Asian wounds in particular, will settled into a neclinilational position and neglect foreign policy com-mitments far more important than those in Indochina ever were. As James Reston of the New York Times write. "The doubt in the allied world about American action now is not about Washington's courage but about its judgment. The major allies ... are merely asking [President Ford] to choose what is primary and what is secondary, not to conclude Saigon or Lon Nol or Southeast Asia with the really critical areas of Europe, the Middle Past and


But can U.S. leadership make such distinctions any longer? After all, over a dicade ago, contrary to the leason of Korea, contrary to the French experience in Indochina and the whole nature of Vietnamese nationalism. America's political and military chieflans slindly committed the nation's heritage is well as its treasury to agh: a "no win" land war in Asia.




