

TWO VIEWS OF THE FUTURE

Nobody knows exectly what the future will bring, but most people have an opinion. At the second general secentify of the World Future Society in Washington, D.C., June 2-8, futurist Herman Kahn, founding director, of the Hudson Institute, presented two otherscentatic (and largely opposing) views on the future. Kahn seked those of us at the futurist conference to inclinate the viewpeint with which we would most closely agree. Interestingly, the response was about equally divided between the two scenarios. Below

is a shortened adaptation of Kahn's original presentation. The left side contains the "bad news, a rather pessimistic inso-Malthusian appraisal of man's future. On the right side is the more optimistic "post-industrial soblety" as viewed by many. *Pain Tarch* invitus our residers to consider both columns, and, if you're so insilined, let us know why you favor one, and not the other. We'll discuss your responses in a reader's forum, and we'll further analyse these visions of the future in forthcoming issues of *Plain Trush.

THE BAD NEWS:

The Basic Model

Fixed Pie: We have a fairly good idea of what this world can provide Therefore, "the finite pie" and "the fixed bewl" are good metaphors, perticularly in thinking about non-renewable or limited resources. We must share more fairly the limited supplies and room of "speccehip earth".

Technology and Capital

Diminishing Returns: New technology and additional capital investment, necessary to extract marginalizesources, will vestly increase pollution — probably to lethal levels — and markedly accelerate the approaching exhaus

Resources

Rapid Depletion: Man is rapidly depleting the earth's food, energy and mineral resources, and even running out of space for getting rid of pollution products. Many key resources will soon be steriously depleted.






